Greetings,

As most of you know, I've spent the past year and a half on a weight loss journey. As of my last doctor's appointment in September I've lost 100 pounds. When I started this journey I refused my specialist's recommendation to use one of the new weight loss medications. I told him that I needed to do this on my own for a while, to prove to myself that I could do it and have that victory through the grace of God. We have often



revisited the subject and I have expressed a willingness to use medication or surgery when the time came that I needed an extra tool to use on this journey. Well...that time has come. The 100 pound loss was exactly the victory that I needed and now it's time to approach this from a different angle. I still have 175 pounds to go and the weight will only be harder to lose as the days go by...thus, after a lot of research and prayerful consideration I have decided to have the weight loss surgery.

I am waiting on a call to schedule my first appointment with the Bariatric Surgeon. Prior to surgery they require that you prove to them, and to your insurance company that you are willing to make the hard changes necessary for the surgery to work and my specialist has assured me that in the last year and a half I have proven that I am willing and able to make those changes. The surgery will limit the amount of food that can be consumed at one time by removing about 80% of the stomach; but it by no means eliminates the hard work the individual still must do on a daily basis. The stomach can be stretched back out by overeating at one time and/or you can still gain wait if you choose to eat constantly throughout the day. Thus this will be a life long journey of maintaining the changes I have already made and the ones still to come.

It'll be a while before I know the date of my surgery but I'm hoping for late this year or in early January and I'm asking for your prayers on this continued journey. After surgery I will be off work for two or three weeks to recover and I'll keep you posted as to when that will occur.




EVERY THURSDAY 10:00 TO 10:45 AM \$1.00 per class

Luke 17:11-19


